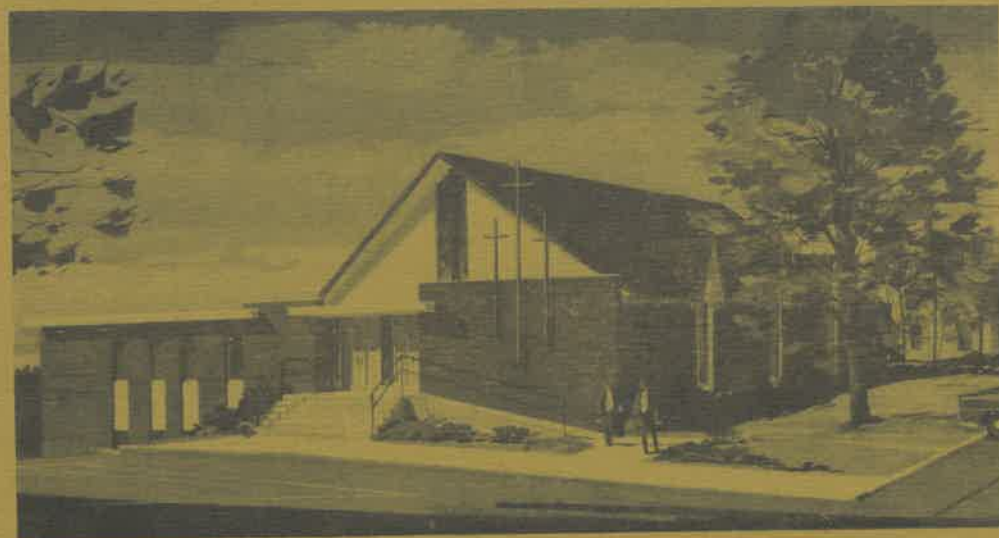

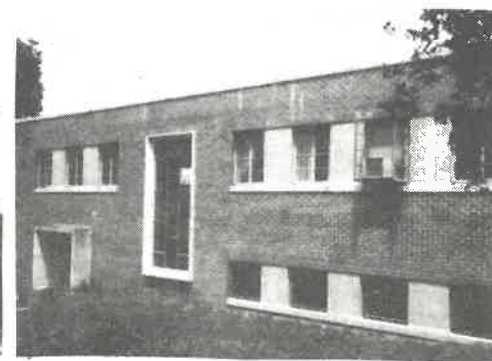

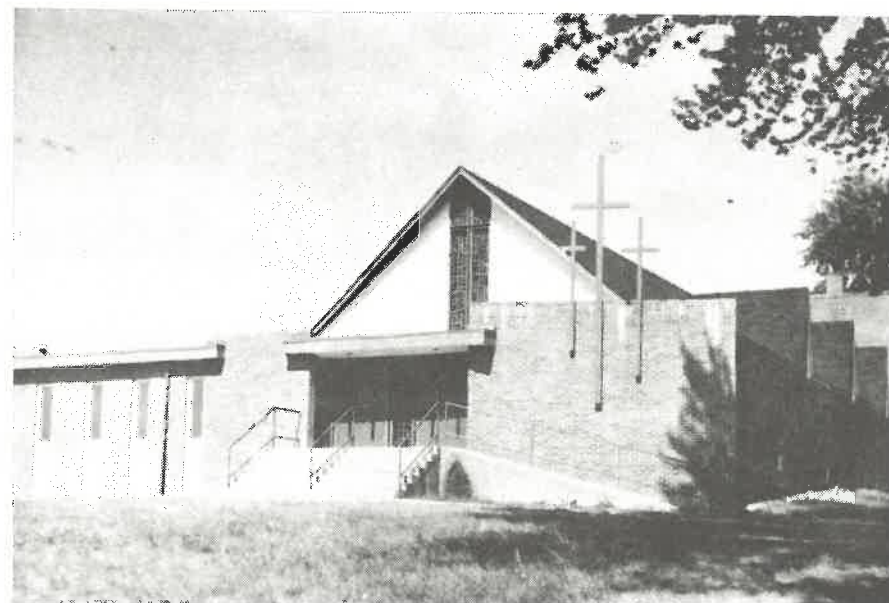

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

Following an initial meeting in December of 1850, the First Baptist Church was constituted on January 18, 1851. Nineteen charter members formed the nucleus of the Church.

The first sanctuary building was erected in 1854. On July 15, 1864 a band of Union raiders burned nearly all the buildings in town. The Baptist Church was spared. Rumor has it that one of the raiders had a relative who was a member of the Church. The building was used for court and other public meetings for a number of years, and served the Church as its house of worship until removal for the construction of the new sanctuary in 1970.

In the 1930's a basement with kitchen and dining facilities was constructed. An educational building was constructed in 1958. In recent years the Church has purchased all houses except one on the block where it is located, with a view to future expansion.

The Church began making plans for construction of a new sanctuary building in late 1967. After much prayer and study, actual construction began in late 1970 following the successful sale of \$135,000.00 worth of church bonds as means for financing the project. The Church's faith was tested early in 1971 because of difficulties confronting the bond company which resulted in construction funds being tied-up and causing construction to cease. But God proved Himself faithful and blessed and strengthened the Church fellowship during this time and by June of 1971 construction was resumed with the people even more aware than before of God's presence and guidance.

Today, the First Baptist Church of Platte City seeks to minister to the needs of our world in Christ's name and stands as a living memorial to the sturdy pioneers who built it and to the dedicated men and women who, through the years, have labored in its fold.

We can only say with the Psalmists of old, " . . . this is the Lord's doing, and is marvelous in our eyes." Pray that it may ever remain so.
